1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The climbing competition is organized as part of the Outdoor mix Festival from Friday, May 22nd to Monday, May 25th, 2026. This event is co-organized by the non-profit association WeAreHautesAlpes, represented by Mr. Brice Clovis, President, and the non-profit association Club Alpin Français d'Embrun, represented by Mr. Guillaume Ponchon.

Check-in and registration close 2 hours before each competition.

2. COMPETITIONS

2.1. Categories

This competition includes 3 categories:

U13

U15

U17 and over

The Junior competition includes the U13 and U15 categories, who will compete on the same bouldering walls.

The Senior competition includes the U17, U19, U21, Senior, Veteran 1, and Veteran 2 categories, who will compete on the same bouldering walls.

2.2. Program

2.3. Qualifications

In a competition, everyone climbs simultaneously.

Each participant has approximately 25 boulder problems to complete, ranging from 5+ to 8a (the number varies depending on the category), within a given time (2 hours 30 minutes). There is no limit to the number of attempts; participants can try the problems as many times as they wish. Attempts are not counted, and there are no zones.

Only successful attempts count.

Each problem is worth 1000 points, divided by the number of successful attempts.

The number of points per participant is calculated based on the number of problems they have completed and the grade of each problem.

The ranking is determined by each participant's total points.

The qualification rounds are self-assessed. Key problems may be monitored. Results sheets (online forms) must be submitted at the end of the qualifications. Problems completed after this period will not be counted. Each competitor will enter their results themselves on an online form provided on the day of the competition. Six women and six men will be selected for the U17 and over overall finals.

The qualification phase is the same as the final phase for competitors in the U13 and U15 categories.

U13 and U15 climbers will compete on the Junior boulders; this competition is called the Junior Contest.

U17 and over climbers will compete in the same category; this competition is called the Senior Contest, and there will be a single podium for all U17 and over categories.

2.4. Notation

The U13 and U15 categories will have to complete as many boulder problems as possible from among 16. These two categories will climb together in a shared wave to ensure the problems are better suited to both age groups. There will be separate rankings and podiums for the U13 and U15 categories, even though they climb in the same wave.

The U17 and older categories compete on the same boulder problems. They will have to complete as many as possible from among the 20 qualifying problems. Each problem has an initial value of 1,000 points. This value will be divided by the number of times it is repeated. Thus, a problem completed 10 times will earn 100 points for each repeater.

The top 6 men and top 6 women from the combined U17 and older categories qualify for the final.

3. CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION & EQUIPMENT

3.1. Finales

L'épreuve d'escalade est ouverte à tous les compétiteurs disposant d'une licence FFCAM ou d'un certificat médical pour la pratique de l'escalade en compétition datant de moins de trois ans à la date de la compétition. Pour toute inscription avec un certificat médical, des frais supplémentaires sont à



prévoir pour l'achat d'une Licence FFCAM journalière à l'accueil de l'événement. Pour les non-licenciés, l'achat de Licences FFCAM journalières permettra un accès à la compétition de 3 jours maximum sur les 4 jours de festival.

Underaged competitors must present parental authorization to participate in the competition. All registrations for the "CLIMBING" competitions are individual, non-transferable, and non-refundable. No refunds, full or partial, will be issued by the organizers.

To take part in the competitions, each competitor must have paid the registration fee for the event (on the website www.outdoormixfestival.com or at the event reception desk), have provided the necessary documents and be equipped with the required equipment.

Before the competition, each competitor must check-in at the event reception desk. Please note that any participant who has not checked-in will not be allowed to participate in the events.

3.2. Matériel

Les **chaussons sont obligatoires** pour accéder à l'épreuve d'escalade. La magnésie liquide ou en poudre est autorisée.

4. INSURANCE & LIABILITY

The organization has taken out insurance covering its own civil liability as organizer, that of its employees, and that of volunteers assisting with the event. Personal accident insurance is also in place to cover bodily injury each participant may sustain, as well as any accidents caused to third parties.

Medical and hospitalization expenses remain the responsibility of the participants (personal insurance). The organization accepts no responsibility for the loss, theft, or damage of personal belongings or equipment and cannot be held liable under any circumstances. No refunds will be issued for participants who withdraw from the race.

5. RESULTS, PODIUMS & PRIZES

At the end of the event, a podium ceremony will reward the best athletes. The result sheets, established according to the competitors' genders and ages, will be displayed in front of the event village reception desk. Prizes will be awarded to the top three athletes in each category, based on the overall ranking:

- U13 Girls Category: Prizes
- U13 Boys Category: Prizes
- U15 Girls Category: Prizes
- U15 Boys Category: Prizes
- U17 and Over Women Category: Prize Money + Prizes
- U17 and Over Men Category: Prize Money + Prizes



The organizer reserves the right to distribute the prizes as they see fit. The presence of prize-winning competitors at the awards ceremony is mandatory. Prizes can't be given to a third party and will not be mailed, with the exception of prize money, which can be paid out via bank transfer after the event.

For the U13 and U15 categories, a podium will be set up once five participants are registered and present.

For the U17 and over category, a podium will be set up once five participants are registered and present.

6. CANCELLATION AND COMMITMENT

The organizers reserve the right to modify these regulations at any time to ensure the safety and well-being of participants. In the event of *force majeure*, the organizers reserve the right to cancel or interrupt the "Climbing" event and will not issue any refunds. Registration for the competition implies full and unconditional acceptance of these regulations. Failure to comply with these rules may result in the competitor's disqualification by the organizers.

WARNING: In the event of *force majeure* or bad weather, the organizers reserve the right to reschedule the events. No refunds will be issued for athletes who fail to be at the rescheduled event times.

As an athlete participating in the Outdoormix Festival, you represent your sport and the event. Therefore, you are asked to respect the staff, the public, other participants, as well as the equipment, facilities, and cleanliness of the site. Failure to comply with these rules of conduct may result in sanctions being applied by the Race Steward (assistance with cleaning or repairs, distribution of promotional items, or even criminal penalties if the Race Steward deems the offense warrants referral to the appropriate authorities).

For the purchasers of the "RIDE & PARTY PASS", the concert evenings are included in the pass; in the event of concert cancellations, no refunds will be issued.

7. COMPLAINTS

Complaints regarding the conduct of the competition or the behavior of other competitors must be submitted in writing and signed by the rider within 60 minutes after the end of the competition. Complaints regarding the results must be filed within 10 minutes after the display of the qualification results.



8. RESPECT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

In order to protect the environment and the natural areas where the event is held, it is strictly forbidden to leave any waste (paper, packaging, plastic, etc.) on the site. Bins will be available and must be used by all participants.

9. IMAGE REPRODUCTION RIGHTS

By participating in the “BOULDERING CONTEST” competition during the 12th edition of the Outdoormix Festival, - which will be held from May 22 to 25, 2026 - each participant expressly authorizes the organizer to use or reproduce their name, image, voice and sporting performance within the framework of this event.
