SPORTS REGULATION BOULDERING CONTEST



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1. GENERAL

The climbing competitions are organized as part of the Outdoormix Festival from Friday June 6 to Monday June 9, 2025. This event is co-organized by the *association loi 1901* WeAreHautesAlpes, represented by Mr. Brice Clovis, as president, and the *association loi 1901* Club Alpin Français d'Embrun, represented by Mr. PONCHON Guillaume.

Check-in and registration close 2 hours before each competition.

2. EVENTS

2.1. Categories

The bouldering contest 3 categories:

- U12
- U14
- U16 and over

The Junior Contest includes U12 and U14 categories. People in these categories will compete on the same boulders.

The Senior contest includes U16, U18, U20, Senior, *Vétéran 1*, *Vétéran 2*. People in these categories will compete on the same boulders.

2.2. Program

The climbing competitions will take place from Friday, June 6 to Monday, June 9, 2025:

2.3. Qualifications

In a Contest, everyone climbs at the same time.

Each participant has around 25 boulders to complete (the number varies depending on the category) in a given time (2 h 30). The difficulty of the boulders ranges from 5+ to 8a. There's no limit to the number of attempts on each boulder, so participants can try the boulders as many times as they want. The number of runs is not counted, and there are no zones.

Only successes count.

Each boulder is worth 1000 points, divided by the number of people who sent the boulder.

The number of points each participant scores is calculated according to the number of boulders sent and the value of each boulder.

The ranking is based on the number of points scored by each participant.

The qualification phases are self-judged. Key boulders may be monitored. Results forms (to be filled in online) are to be handed in at the end of the qualifications. Boulders sent after this time will not be counted.

Each competitor will fill in his or her own results on an online form given on the day of the competition. 6 women and 6 men will be selected for the U16 and over finals.

The qualification phase is the same as the final phase for competitors in the U12 and U14 categories (Junior Contest).

U12 and U14 competitors will climb on the Junior boulders, and the competition will be called **Junior Contest**.

The U16 and over compete in the same category, the competition is called **Senior Contest**, and there will be one and only one common podium for the Senior Contest.

2.4. Ranking

Contestants in the U12 and U14 categories will have to sent as many boulders as they can among 16 boulders. Contestants in both categories will climb at the same time but there will be separate rankings and podiums.

Contestants in the U16 and above categories will compete on the same boulders. They will have to send as many boulders as possible among the 20 qualification boulders. Each boulder has an initial value of 1,000 points. This value will be divided by the number of contestants who send the boulder. Thus, a bloc sent by 10 contestants will have a final value of 100 points.

The 6 highest scoring men and the 6 highest scoring women in the Senior competition will be qualified for the finals.



3. ACCESS AND MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

3.1. Finales

The climbing competition is opened to any contestant with a FFCAM (French Federation for Mountaineering) license or a medical certificate issued less than 3 years before the competition, stating that the contestant is able to practice climbing competitively.

Every participant, registering with a medical certificate will have to purchase a temporary FFCAM license to enter the competition.

Every registration to the climbing competition is individual, nominative and non-transferable. No partial or full reimbursement will be given by the organisation.

To enter the competition, every contestant must have paid the registration fee (on the event website <u>www.outdoormixfestival.com</u> or at the event reception desk), given the mandatory documents and be equipped with the mandatory equipment. On top of that, underage contestants will have to present a parental authorization.

The Senior contest is open to up to 120 contestants. The Junior Contest is open to up to 40 contestants (U12 and U14 categories combined).

3.2. Equipment

Climbing shoes are mandatory to participate in the Climbing Contests. Liquid and powder chalk are authorized.

4. INSURANCE AND LIABILITY

The organization takes out insurance covering its own civil liability as organizer, those of its employees and those of people volunteering to help organize the event. "Individual accident" insurance is also taken out to cover bodily injury to participants themselves, as well as accidents caused to third parties. Participants are responsible for their own medical and hospitalization expenses (personal insurance). The organization declines all responsibility for loss, theft or damage to material or individual equipment, and cannot be held liable under any circumstances. No reimbursement will be made if a participant withdraws during the race.

5. PODIUMS & PRIZES

At the end of the event, a podium will reward the top three finishers. The various rankings, based on competitors' gender and age, will be posted in front of the event village reception desk. Prizes will be awarded to the top three finishers in each category and gender, based on the overall ranking:

- U12 women category : prizes
- U12 men category : prizes



- U14 women category : prizes
- U14 men category : prizes
- U16 and above women category : prize money and prizes
- U16 and above men category : prize money and prizes

The organizer reserves the right to distribute the prizes as he sees fit.

Competitors must attend the prize-giving ceremony. Prizes will not be given to a third party and will not be sent by post, with the exception of prize money, for which a transfer may be made after the event.

For contestants competing in the U12 and U14 categories, a podium will be held only if there is more than 3 contestants in each category.

For contestants competing in the senior competition, a podium will be held only if there are more than 5 contestants in each category.

6. CANCELLATION AND COMMITMENT

The organization reserves the right to modify the present rules at any time, in order to ensure the interest and safety of the participants. In the event of force majeure, the organization reserves the right to cancel or interrupt the climbing event, and will not be entitled to any reimbursement. Registration for the competition implies full acceptance of the present regulations. Failure to comply with these rules may result in the withdrawal of the competitor's number.

WARNING: in the event of force majeure or bad weather, the organization reserves the right to move the events. No reimbursement will be made in the event of a competitor's non-attendance at the modified event times.

As an Outdoormix Festival contestpant, you are the image of your sport and of the event. We therefore ask you to respect the staff, the public and other participants, as well as the equipment, structures and cleanliness of the site. Failure to comply with these rules of good manners may result in sanctions being applied by the Race Steward (help with cleaning or repairs, distribution of goodies, or even criminal sanctions if the Race Steward deems that the offence requires referral to the appropriate authorities).

For "FULL PASS" purchases, concert evenings are included in the pass. In the event of concert cancellation, no refund will be made.

7. COMPLAINTS

Complaints concerning the conduct of the event or the behaviour of other competitors must be submitted in writing and signed by the competitor within 60 minutes of the facts being established. Complaints concerning the ranking must be submitted within 30 minutes of the results being



announced and posted.

8. RESPECT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

In order to respect the environment and the natural spaces crossed, it is strictly forbidden to leave waste (paper, packaging, plastic...) on the site. Garbage cans will be available and must be used by competitors.

9. IMAGE RIGHTS

By participating in the "Bouldering Contest" competition during the 11th edition of the Outdoormix Festival to be held from June 6 to 9, 2025, each participant expressly authorizes the organizer to use or reproduce his or her name, image, voice and sporting performance in connection with this event.
