SPORTS REGULATION LONGBOARD



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1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The longboard competition is organized as part of the Outdoormix Festival from Friday, May 22nd to Monday, May 25th, 2026. This event is co-organized by the non-profit association WeAreHautesAlpes, represented by Mr. Brice Clovis, President, and the French Federation of rollerskating and skating.

Every competitor taking part in this competition is expected to be familiar with these regulations. They agree to abide by all of its provisions without reservation for the four days of the competition.

Check-in and registration close 2 hours before each competition.

2. COMPETITIONS

2.1. Le Freeride

Il s'agit d'un contest convivial se déroulant du vendredi 22 mai au lundi 25 mai 2026. Il s'agit d'un Freeride sur la route de Baratier prévue à cet effet.

La route se situe en direction de la station des Orres, à cinq minutes en voiture et à trente minutes à pied du plan d'eau d'Embrun.

Celle-ci est d'une distance d'environ 3 km, d'un dénivelé négatif d'environ 250 mètres et composée de 5 virages en épingle. La pente moyenne de la piste est de 8,3 %.

2.2. Étape du Championnat de France

L'étape du championnat de France sera organisée autour d'une phase de qualification puis une finale. Cette épreuve se déroulera sur la route des Orres.

Cette étape du Championnat de France comprend les horaires de Freeride, notamment le vendredi et le samedi.

La première phase de qualification sera chronométrée. La finale se déroulera sous la forme d'un boarder cross. Le podium se fera sur le village événement du festival.

3. CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION & EQUIPMENT

3.1. Conditions of participation

The Freeride event is open to everyone, both FFRS (French Federation of Roller Sports) members and non-members, under the conditions outlined below.

Competitors holding a license issued by the French Federation of Roller Sports and Skateboarding (FFRS) that specifies their fitness to practice longboarding may participate. They must provide their license or a legible photocopy.

Non-members may also participate in the Freeride event provided they present a medical certificate stating that there are no contraindications to practicing longboarding, dated within three years of the event.

An additional fee of €10 will be payable upon registration.

Underaged competitors must present parental authorization to participate in the competition. All registrations for the "LONGBOARD" events are individual, non-transferable, and non-refundable. No refunds, full or partial, will be issued by the organizers.

To take part in the competitions, each competitor must have paid the registration fee for the event (on the website www.outdoormixfestival.com or at the event reception desk), have provided the necessary documents and be equipped with the required equipment.

Before the competition, each competitor must check-in at the event reception desk. Please note that any participant who has not checked-in will not be allowed to participate in the events.

3.2. Equipment

3.2.1. Longskate

The total weight must not exceed six (6) kg.

The maximum length is one hundred and fifty (150) cm. The maximum width is fifty (50) cm.

3.2.2. Streetluge

The total weight must not exceed twenty-five (25) kg. The length must not exceed three hundred (300) cm. The maximum width is sixty (60) cm.

The front and rear of the sled must have shock-absorbing pads if the sled weighs more than six (6) kg.

3.2.3. Rollers

- Roller skates with two pairs of parallel wheels or with a maximum of six wheels in a line are



permitted. The following criteria must be met:

- Their length must not exceed 50 cm (axle to axle).
- The skates must be securely attached to the boots.
- The axles must not protrude beyond the wheels or frames. Any mechanical braking system is prohibited.

3.2.4. Les Buttboards

Buttboards must be made from a single piece of wood no more than 125 cm long and 30.5 cm wide, with wheels no more than 70 mm in diameter and trucks and wheels that do not protrude from the board.

3.3. Forbidden equipment

3.3.1. Le Drift Trike

Drift trikes are not allowed to ride on the freeride track at Baratier during scheduled freeride times, namely between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. between Friday 22 and Monday 25 May 2026.

3.3.2. Le Freeboard

Drift trikes are not allowed to ride on the freeride track at Baratier during scheduled freeride times, namely between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. between Friday 22 and Monday 25 May 2026.

3.4. Equipment for riders

3.4.1. Freeride

Wearing a full-face helmet will be mandatory, as well as knee pads, a back protector, gloves, and pucks. Full-body suits and elbow pads are strongly advised and recommended.

We remind you that protective gear is designed to protect you; we recommend you keep it on even when not on the track.

3.4.2. Etape du championnat de France

Wearing full leathers is mandatory (except for rollerblades), as well as a certified helmet (CE or other certifications), gloves, and a back protector (if it is not already integrated into the leathers).

We remind you that protective gear is designed to protect you; we recommend wearing it even when not on the track.

3.5. Niveau de pratique minimale

Each participant must know how to brake and steer. The head referee reserves the right to stop any participant deemed a danger to others (e.g., complete beginners with less than 15 to 20 hours of



experience).

Absolute beginners should refrain from participating. The organizer will not issue any refunds for longboard passes if a person is not skilled enough to ride the freeride course. It is each rider's responsibility to be aware of the difficulty level of the course.

4. PARCOURS / BALISAGE / CHRONOMÈTRE

The Freeride course is 3 km long with a 250-meter vertical drop and 5 hairpin turns. This course is unique, and each participant must follow it.

The road is closed during the participants' descents. Nets and mats are installed along the entire route to ensure the safety of the athletes.

The start and finish lines are physically marked with equipment.

The race organizers reserve the right to make last-minute course changes for safety reasons. In this case, announcements will be made over the public address system.

The Race Commissioner is responsible for overseeing the sporting and safety aspects of the competition. The Commissioner is solely responsible for timeouts for mechanical issues and the application of penalties. They will also act as the Technical Delegate (TD) if no one else has been designated for this purpose. The following penalties will be applied:

Parking on the course or riding against traffic on the track: disqualification.

Refusal to comply with an official's instructions: disqualification.

Getting off the course while athletes are returning or when the road is being opened: disqualification.

Failure to wear mandatory protective gear during the race: disqualification.

This list is not exhaustive, and any penalty may be imposed by the Race Commissioner if a competitor fails to comply with these race regulations, engages in dangerous behavior, or disrupts the smooth running of the event.

Marshals will be stationed along the entire course to ensure the safety of the runners and to ensure that all competitors adhere to the race rules.

Competitors are aware of the risks involved in participating in the event and the dangers of the road conditions.

5. RESULTS & PODIUMS

At the end of the French Championships, a podium ceremony will reward the best athletes. The result sheets, established according to the competitors' genders and ages, will be displayed in front



of the event village reception desk. Prizes will be awarded to the top three athletes in each category, based on the overall ranking:

- Longboard
- Streetluge & Buttboard
- Rollerblade

The organizer reserves the right to distribute the prizes as they see fit. The presence of prize-winning competitors at the awards ceremony is mandatory. Prizes can't be given to a third party and will not be mailed, with the exception of prize money, which can be paid out via bank transfer after the event.

For all categories, a podium will be set up once five participants are registered and present. If there is less than 5 contestants present, there won't be a reward ceremony in the category.

6. INSURANCE & LIABILITY

The organization takes out insurance covering its own civil liability as organizer, that of its employees, and that of volunteers assisting with the event. Personal accident insurance is also in place to cover bodily injury each participant may sustain, as well as any accidents caused to third parties.

Medical and hospitalization expenses remain the responsibility of the participants (personal insurance). The organization accepts no liability for loss, theft, or damage to personal belongings or equipment and cannot be held responsible under any circumstances. No refunds will be issued for participants who withdraw from the event.

7. CANCELLATION AND COMMITMENT

The organizers reserve the right to modify these regulations at any time to ensure the safety and well-being of participants. In the event of *force majeure*, the organizers reserve the right to cancel or interrupt the "Longboard" event and will not issue any refunds. Registration for the competition implies full and unconditional acceptance of these regulations. Failure to comply with these rules may result in the competitor's disqualification by the organizers.

WARNING: In the event of *force majeure* or bad weather, the organizers reserve the right to reschedule the events. No refunds will be issued for athletes who fail to be at the rescheduled event times.

As an athlete participating in the Outdoormix Festival, you represent your sport and the event. Therefore, you are asked to respect the staff, the public, other participants, as well as the equipment, facilities, and cleanliness of the site. Failure to comply with these rules of conduct may result in



sanctions being applied by the Race Steward (assistance with cleaning or repairs, distribution of promotional items, or even criminal penalties if the Race Steward deems the offense warrants referral to the appropriate authorities).

For the purchasers of the “RIDE & PARTY PASS”, the concert evenings are included in the pass; in the event of concert cancellations, no refunds will be issued.

8. COMPLAINTS

Complaints regarding the conduct of the competition or the behavior of other competitors must be submitted in writing and signed by the rider within 60 minutes after the end of the competition.

9. RESPECT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

In order to protect the environment and the natural areas where the event is held, it is strictly forbidden to leave any waste (paper, packaging, plastic, etc.) on the site. Bins will be available and must be used by all participants.

10. IMAGE REPRODUCTION RIGHTS

By participating in the “LONGBOARD” events during the 12th edition of the Outdoormix Festival, - which will be held from May 22 to 25, 2026 - each participant expressly authorizes the organizer to use or reproduce their name, image, voice and sporting performance within the framework of this event.
