1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The MTB Dirt competitions are organized as part of the Outdoormix Festival from Friday, May 22nd to Monday, May 25th, 2026. This event is organized by the non-profit association WeAreHautesAlpes, represented by Mr. Brice Clovis, President.

The Spine Ramp and the wooden kickers on the Dirt field are supplied and assembled by New Air Concept.

Check-in and registration close 2 hours before each competition.

The presence of all participants one hour before the start of the qualifying and final rounds is mandatory. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

2. COMPETITIONS & TRAINING

The "MTB DIRT" event is an FMB Bronze competition taking place on Saturday, May 23rd and Sunday, May 24th, 2026. It is a competition judged on a specially designed dirt track.

The course is located at the event village, by the Embrun lake. The temporary track is built solely for this event.

Each participant has two runs to achieve the best score. At the judges' discretion only, a third run may be granted to one or all participants.

The starting order for the qualifying rounds is determined by the order of registration or by the number on the participant's number plate. The qualifying results influence the starting order for the final, ensuring that the last qualifier is the first competitor to run, and the first qualifier is the last to complete their final run. Open practice sessions are available to participants throughout the day on Friday, May 22nd and Saturday, May 23rd. Official training sessions, mandatory for all remaining participants, will take place on Saturday, May 23rd and Sunday, May 24th, one hour before each competition.

The organizers, race officials, and judges may hold a meeting with the athletes to explain the rules and race instructions, or to share any other information.

WARNING: In case of force majeure or inclement weather, the organizers reserve the right to reschedule the events for Monday, May 25th. No refunds will be issued for athletes who fail to appear at the rescheduled event times.

3. CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION & EQUIPMENT

3.1. Conditions of participation

The "MTB DIRT" event is open to all competitors holding either a current FMB license or a medical certificate, dated less than 3 years prior to the competition date, authorizing participation in this sport.

All registrations for the "MTB DIRT" event are individual, non-transferable, and non-refundable. No full or partial refunds will be issued by the organizers.

The minimum age requirement is 16 years. Riders are divided into categories based on their age as of December 31st of the year in question. Minors are required to provide, in addition to other documents, parental authorization for competitive MTB DIRT participation.

For this competition, there will be only one category, common to all ages. No junior or women's categories are planned. All athletes are registered for only one competition per discipline.

Underaged competitors must present parental authorization to participate in the competition.

All registrations for the "MTB DIRT" competitions are individual, non-transferable, and non-refundable. No refunds, full or partial, will be issued by the organizers.

To take part in the competitions, each competitor must have paid the registration fee for



the event (on the website www.outdoormixfestival.com or at the event reception desk), have provided the necessary documents and be equipped with the required equipment.

Before the competition, each competitor must check-in at the event reception desk. Please note that any participant who has not checked-in will not be allowed to participate in the events.

3.2. Equipment

Bicycles: Only mountain bikes specifically designed for dirt jumping and slopestyle will be permitted for this event. Full-suspension bikes and classic mountain bikes are prohibited. The Race Commissioner may inspect the equipment. In the event of non-compliance, the Race Commissioner may disqualify the rider.

Rider Equipment: Wearing an approved helmet (open-face, ear-padded, or full-face) is mandatory for cycling. Wearing any other specific cycling protection (back protector, knee pads, elbow pads, shin guards) is strongly recommended. Clothing, by its design or construction, must not pose a safety hazard to the rider. Similarly, the design or printed advertising on clothing must not contain any offensive statements or images that could harm the image of the organizer or the sport.

4. ROUTE / MARKINGS / SAFETY

The course consists of a cat's tongue at the start, followed by three jumps (a wooden module with a dirt landing) and a final module. Participants are judged on the quality of their run during the qualifying rounds and finals.

The course is marked with flagging tape. The start and finish lines are therefore physically marked by the installation of sports structures.

The Race Commissioner is officially responsible for overseeing the sporting and safety aspects of the competition. The Commissioner is solely responsible for timeouts for mechanical issues and for applying penalties. Confirming the runners' presence and awarding prizes are also their responsibility. They will also act as the Technical Delegate if no one else has been appointed for this purpose.

The following penalties will be applied:

Parking on the course or driving in the wrong direction on the track: disqualification.

Refusal to comply with a race official's instructions: disqualification.

Testing during the race and outside of official practice runs: disqualification.

Failure to wear mandatory protective gear during the race: disqualification.

This list is not exhaustive, and any penalty may be imposed by the Race Commissioner if a competitor fails to comply with these race regulations, engages in dangerous behavior, or disrupts the smooth running of the event.



Shapers and marshals will be stationed at each jump on the course to ensure the safety of the riders and to ensure that all competitors adhere to the race rules.

5. INSURANCE & LIABILITY

The organization has taken out insurance covering its own civil liability as organizer, that of its employees, and that of volunteers assisting with the event. Personal accident insurance is also in place to cover bodily injury each participant may sustain, as well as any accidents caused to third parties.

Medical and hospitalization expenses remain the responsibility of the participants (personal insurance). The organization accepts no responsibility for the loss, theft, or damage of personal belongings or equipment and cannot be held liable under any circumstances. No refunds will be issued for participants who withdraw from the race.

FFC members participating in events not listed on the FFC calendar (federal and/or regional) are not covered by the insurance associated with the license purchased through you from our federation. Therefore, and under the aforementioned conditions, FFC members are not covered for personal accident insurance when participating in these types of events. The same applies to the civil liability coverage (damage caused to third parties) associated with the license.

6. RESULTS, PODIUMS & PRIZES

The scores are awarded by the judges for each rider in accordance with the principles of equality between athletes and objectivity, based on the following criteria: the quality of the overall run / the difficulty and diversity of the figures / the amplitude on each jump / the cleanliness of the landings.

The competitors are judged by a minimum of three judges. In this case, all three scores are combined to determine the participant's final score; only the highest score across all runs during the qualifying and final rounds will be retained. If five judges are present, the highest and lowest scores will be discarded.

Complaints are permitted but must be submitted to the Race Director and the Judges.

One of the judges is designated as the main or lead judge for the "MTB DIRT" event. He is responsible for the work of the other judges, and must ensure that the results are published, and that ties are broken in accordance with the procedures and limits established by these regulations.

At the end of the competition, a podium will be established by the judges based on the participants' scores. Prizes, including a prize money of €2,000, will be awarded to the top three athletes according to the overall ranking for each event. The organizer reserves the right to distribute the prize money as they see fit.



The organizer reserves the right to open new categories for the podiums once there are more than five registered participants in that category. This will affect the distribution of prizes and prize money between the existing categories and these new categories.

The presence of all competitors at the awards ceremony is mandatory. Prizes cannot be given to a third party and will not be sent by mail at a later date, with the exception of prize money, which can be paid out via bank transfer after the event.

A podium will be set up for each category once five participants are registered and present.

This differs from the ranking which awards points to riders in the FMB general classification.

7. CANCELLATION AND COMMITMENT

The organizers reserve the right to modify these regulations at any time to ensure the safety and well-being of participants. In the event of *force majeure*, the organizers reserve the right to cancel or interrupt the "MTB Dirt" event and will not issue any refunds. Registration for the competition implies full and unconditional acceptance of these regulations. Failure to comply with these rules may result in the competitor's disqualification by the organizers.

WARNING: In the event of *force majeure* or bad weather, the organizers reserve the right to reschedule the events. No refunds will be issued for athletes who fail to be at the rescheduled event times.

As an athlete participating in the Outdoormix Festival, you represent your sport and the event. Therefore, you are asked to respect the staff, the public, other participants, as well as the equipment, facilities, and cleanliness of the site. Failure to comply with these rules of conduct may result in sanctions being applied by the Race Steward (assistance with cleaning or repairs, distribution of promotional items, or even criminal penalties if the Race Steward deems the offense warrants referral to the appropriate authorities).

For the purchasers of the "RIDE & PARTY PASS", the concert evenings are included in the pass; in the event of concert cancellations, no refunds will be issued.

8. COMPLAINTS

Complaints regarding the conduct of the competition or the behavior of other competitors must be submitted in writing and signed by the rider within 60 minutes after the end of the competition. Complaints regarding the results must be filed within 30 minutes after the display of the results.



9. RESPECT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

In order to protect the environment and the natural areas where the event is held, it is strictly forbidden to leave any waste (paper, packaging, plastic, etc.) on the site. Bins will be available and must be used by all participants.

10. IMAGE REPRODUCTION RIGHTS

By participating in the “MTB DIRT” competition during the 12th edition of the Outdoormix Festival, - which will be held from May 22 to 25, 2026 - each participant expressly authorizes the organizer to use or reproduce their name, image, voice and sporting performance within the framework of this event.
